



Kapi'olani Community College Transfer Report From Academic Year 2008-2009

Methodology: The National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) was used to search for subsequent enrollment of all students enrolled and home based at Kapi'olani Community College (KapCC) during the 2008-2009 academic year (fall, spring, or summer semesters.) A search was conducted for the first transfer

institution from the last semester in which the student was registered and home based at KapCC until August 2010. Records for 8,621 students were submitted to the NSC, and 37 transfer institutions were identified which accepted at least three former KapCC students.

Limitations of Methodology:

The National Student Clearinghouse StudentTracker system provides attendance data for more than 3,300 institutions accounting for more than 92% of the national college enrollment. In Hawai'i, Hawai'i Pacific University does not report attendance to the NSC. Hawai'i Pacific University enrolls over 8,000 students and may represent a relatively large, unknown proportion of the KapCC transfers.

Of the 8,621 student records submitted to the NSC, 886 students had no response data available. An additional 20 records were blocked by the students. The NSC reports transfers to all participating institutions, but the current

brief only reports transfer institutions with at least three former KapCC students.

Finding: As shown in the first table, 37 transfer institutions accepted 1,397 of the 8,621 former KapCC students. The top three transfer institutions were other schools within the University of Hawai‘i system. These three schools accepted 990 or 71% of the KapCC transfers. The top two transfer schools from outside the UH system were the Heald College (ranked 4th with 66 students or 5% of the transfers) and the online University of Phoenix (ranked 7th with 34 students or 2% of the transfers.) The top transfer school physically located outside of the state of Hawai‘i was the University of Southern California (ranked 14th with 8 students or slightly over one half of a percent of the transfers.)

The second table presents a breakdown of the 37 transfer institutions by state. California and Hawai‘i are home to over 70% of the transfer schools, and the remaining transfer institutions were located in only six other states.

The majority of the transfer institutions are 4-year rather than 2-year schools (65% vs. 35%.) The majority also are public rather than private schools (59% vs. 41%.)
